Certificate Requirements

- **15 credits of coursework related to Latin America at graduate level (6000+).**
 - Students may count up to 9 credits for the following activities with prior approval: directed readings, field research, practicum, study abroad, and internship experiences when related to Latin America and have graduate credit assigned. To meet the course requirement, we would need one MA course paper focused on Latin America.
- **Coursework must be taken within at least two different academic Departments.**
- **All courses must be approved** by the Center for Latin American Studies, pre-approval is highly recommended to ensure credit.
- **Demonstrate intermediate to intermediate-high reading and oral proficiency** in one of the following Latin American Languages: Spanish, Portuguese, Nahuatl, Quechua/Kichwa.
 - Proficiency requirements:
 - *Spanish/Portuguese- Intermediate-high (3000+)
 - *Latin American Indigenous languages for example: Nahuatl, Quechua/Kichwa- Intermediate (2000+)
 - *Native Speaker of Latin American Language
 - This can be met by passing a language evaluation through the World Languages and Cultures office, completing a language course at the 3000 level or higher, providing a qualifying passport of a country that speaks your native language or providing evidence of native speaker proficiency.
- **Complete 1 graduate project** with minimum 25% content related to Latin America (e.g. dissertation, master's project paper/thesis or graduate level paper. *A full list can be seen in section V.*)
 - In lieu of a graduate project, a student may complete an additional 3 credits of Latin America-related coursework.
- **Complete a 1-2 pg. Reflection Paper** summarizing your research experience and coursework with an emphasis on how interdisciplinary and diverse perspectives have enhanced your understanding of Latin America and how this will benefit you in your future academic or career goals.
